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ANSWER KEY

Temporary:

3 types of people- returning to workforce; just out of high school; unemployed for any reason, in transition, work for variety of companies to find niche.

False.

Qualities/skills- communication skills, be on time, work well with others.

Temp-to-hire- permanent temporary worker; goes on temporary assignment, then is hired by the company.

Military:

3 requirements- high school graduate or GED (note: at print time, this was being reconsidered; high school graduate may no longer be a requirement); good moral character, honor, commitment, desire to learn; good physical condition, drug-free.

Time of commitment- 2, 6

Advantages- travel, training/learn new skills, early retirement (usually age 55), and gain confidence.

Apprenticeships: (Learn while you can)

Apprentice- one who learns a job by working alongside a skilled worker.

Trades- carpenter/construction, plumber, electrician

3 requirements- 18 years old, high school graduate or GED, ability to work cooperatively, eager and willing to work and learn

Training- 3, 4, or 5 years plus attending classes
